

2018-19 Alleyn's School Public Benefit Summary

Educational Links = There are 55 partnerships, 40 of which involve 309 pupils.
Financial Support = 100 pupils received means-tested financial support in excess of £1.8m.

Sharing Facilities = 1497 hours of access to facilities were provided to both local schools and community groups involving over 5,000 people throughout the year, of these totals 589 hours of use were provided to local schools involving over 3,900 school children.

Volunteering

Pupils from Years 10-13 volunteer at local primary schools; Watergate School for children with severe learning disabilities; Residential Care Homes for the Elderly; and provide computer skills support for the elderly in the community.

Rhythm for Reading

Year 12 students act as reading mentors to Year 4 pupils at local Primary Schools as part of an innovative music and literacy project.

Southwark Schools Learning Partnership (SSLP) a consortium of maintained and independent schools promoting educational opportunities across the sectors.

Saturday Maths

Four tutors teaching 52 Year 5 pupils from twelve local Primary Schools, with the help of over 50 Alleyn's pupil mentors from Year 11.

Primary School Teaching

112 Year 12 students took part in our Outreach programme with 8 partner Primary schools, benefiting over 600 primary school children. Projects included Greek Art (Belham), Science (Heber), Sport and Fitness (Crawford), Animation (Harris Academy), Rhythm for Reading (Goodrich) Drama (Elmwood) and Music (Rosendale).

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Means-tested Bursary Support

Alleyn's funds 100 means-tested bursaries (of which 66 are fully funded) and we are fundraising to increase that number. These bursaries are funded from money received from The Dulwich Estate, The Worshipful Company of Saddlers and other donors.

Additional financial support

Money from the Dulwich Estate and the Pupil Support Fund is able to assist some bursary recipients with free school lunches, transport costs, uniform grants and other incidental costs.

Alleyn's Benevolent Fund

13 pupils have been fully or partly funded by the Pupil Support Fund, 12 of whom received full or partial support for Educational Visits. The PSF has also helped bursary recipients with the cost of travel and/or music lessons.

EMA Equivalent Payments

We continue to provide discretionary financial support to pupils in Years 12 and 13.

SHARING FACILITIES

School PE lessons,

Sports Fixtures and Forest School
 The playing fields at Townley Road are made available to two primary schools each week to deliver PE lessons and forest school activities to their pupils. Another primary school uses the Burbage Road Sports Ground on a regular basis to run after school sports clubs.

Mini-football pitches are made available on a Saturday morning to the Lambeth & Southwark Primary Schools Football League to assist with their delivery of a 36 team 9v9 competition on a Saturday morning.

The Burbage Road Ground hosted cricket and football matches on behalf of two secondary schools, in addition to hosting a South London Schools Football Association final and representative fixtures.

School Performing Arts

Four primary schools used the theatre and performing arts facilities to host end of term productions with assistance provided by Alleyn's technical staff.

Kings College Hospital

Held a family fun day at for families of children living with diabetes.

London Schools Cricket Association

Regularly used the sports hall for winter nets and played representative fixtures on the school's pitches.

Venue Space For Charitable Purposes

'The Dulwich Society, 'The Dulwich Youth Orchestra', 'The XLP Youth Charity', 'Link Age Southwark', 'Montage Theatre Arts', 'Think Malawi' and the 'Southwark Police Cadets' were provided with access to venues in support of their organisation. This allowed these community groups to meet, to perform, to fundraise or to spread awareness of their cause.

Swimming Pool

Our swimming teachers delivered an intensive learn-to-swim programme to three primary schools throughout the year.

A disabled swimmer has been given regular pool time to aid her development and assist in her classification as a competitive para-swimmer.

Alleyn's provided a venue for the Southwark Primary Schools Swimming Gala and held training sessions for the Southwark Waterpolo squad that entered the London Youth Games.

A swim-a-thon organised by local children raised funds for Cancer Research.

School Sports Days

The fields and athletics track was used to host seven sports days, encompassing well over 2,500 pupils and parent spectators.

5th Camberwell Beavers

A wide range of spaces including the observatory, swimming pool, athletics track and science classrooms have been provided to the Beavers to help them obtain various badges and challenge awards.

Free tickets provided to Almshouse residents to attend talks and shows held in our theatre.
