2015-2016 Alleyn's School Public Benefit

Over 300 hours of use provided to local schools this year, involving over 2,000 school children.
(In 2016/17 this should rise to circa 450 hours and 2500 children)

3,500 hours of public access per year

450 hours use of our performing arts facility per year

Over 40 sporting and non-sporting activities, involving over 3,000 people, supported through our Community programme

USE OF FACILITIES

Woodcraft Folk Youth Group

Charity works with children to promote confidence, understanding about the world and how to value each other.

Miles for Haemophilia

The charity used the School facilities to film an awareness piece for a national campaign.

London School's Cricket Association

Regularly use the sports hall for winter nets and play numerous representative fixtures on the School's pitches. Annual awards evening held in the theatre.

London Youth Games

Pool hosted swimming and water polo trials on behalf of Southwark. Provided venue for training sessions ahead of the competition.

School Swimming Lessons

Swimming Pool Manager delivered a learn-to-swim programme over two weeks to a local primary school.

Three local primary and one secondary school use the performing arts facility, and Alleyn's technical staff, to host end of term productions.

National Debating Contest

Regional heats for national debate held at Alleyn's involving 200 pupils from 31 secondary Schools across England.

Fundraising Events

Theatre used to raise funds for numerous charities - 'Brass for Africa', 'British Red Cross', 'The Women's Aid'

Montage Theatre Arts

A youth theatre group showcased two productions in the theatre as part of their submission to *The National Theatre Connections* project.

Local Church used our facilities to run a week of subsidised sport for children within their parish.

Southwark Volunteer Police Cadets

Continue to host 'Christmas Tree Project' distributing presents to child in care in Southwark.

The National Youth Choir of GB

Use the Music School facilities to run their London auditions.

Local primary schools use the fields and athletics track to host sports days, encompassing well over 2,000 pupils.

Local secondary school use the fields at Burbage Road to host football matches and training sessions.

EDUCATIONAL LINKS

Volunteering

Alleyn's pupils from Years 10-13 volunteer at local primary schools, Watergate School for children with severe learning disabilities and The Elms Residential Care Home for the Elderly.

Rhythm for Reading:

Year 12 Alleyn's students act as reading mentors to Year 4 pupils at state Primary Schools as part of an innovative music and literacy project.

Southwark Schools Learning Partnership (SSLP) a consortium of maintained and independent schools promoting links across the sectors.

Saturday Maths

Four tutors teaching 52 Year 5 pupils from twelve local Primary Schools, with the help of over 50 Alleyn's pupil mentors from Year 11.

Primary School Teaching

35 Year 12 students have taken part in our Outreach programme so far and another 35 are set to participate after Christmas. We now have five partner Primary schools

Sweet Readers

48 Lower School pupils working with elderly people suffering from Alzheimer's Disease

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Bursary Support

Alleyn's funds 77 means-tested bursaries (of which 53 are fully funded) and we are fundraising to increase that number. These bursaries are funded from money received from The Dulwich Estate, The Worshipful Company of Saddlers and other donors.

Additional financial support

Money from the Dulwich Estate and the Pupils Support Fund is able to assist some bursary recipients with free school lunches, transport costs and/or uniform grants.

Alleyn's Benevolent Fund:

31 pupils have been fully or partly funded by the Pupil Support Fund, 25 of whom received full or partial support for Educational Visits. The PSF has also helped bursary recipients with the cost of travel and/or music lessons.

EMA Equivalent Payments

We continue to provide discretionary financial support to pupils in Years 12 and 13.
