

2016-17 Alleyn's School Public Benefit

Educational Links = 231 Alleyn's pupils involved within the community across 39 partnerships.

Financial Support = 84 pupils received means-tested financial support in excess of £1.4m.

Use of Facilities = 1173.50 hours of access to facilities were provided to both local schools and community groups involving over 3,900 people throughout the year, of these totals 498 hours of use were provided to local schools involving 2,300 school children.

EDUCATIONAL LINKS

Volunteering

Pupils from Years 10-13 volunteer at local primary schools; Watergate School for children with severe learning disabilities; The Elms Residential Care Home for the Elderly; and provide computer skills support for the elderly in the community.

Rhythm for Reading

Year 12 students act as reading mentors to Year 4 pupils at local Primary Schools as part of an innovative music and literacy project.

Southwark Schools Learning Partnership (SSLP)

a consortium of maintained and independent schools promoting links across the sectors.

Saturday Maths

Four tutors teaching 52 Year 5 pupils from twelve local Primary Schools, with the help of over 50 Alleyn's pupil mentors from Year 11.

Primary School Teaching

70 Year 12 students have taken part in our Outreach programme so far. We now have five partner Primary schools. Projects included Abstract Art (Heber Primary), Animation (Harris Academy), Sport and Fitness (St. Anthony's Primary), Dance and Storytelling (Harris Academy), Abstract Art (The Belham Primary), Rhythm for Reading (Goodrich Primary).

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Bursary Support

Alleyn's funds 84 means-tested bursaries (of which 59 are fully funded) and we are fundraising to increase that number. These bursaries are funded from money received from The Dulwich Estate, The Worshipful Company of

Additional financial support

Money from the Dulwich Estate and the Pupils Support Fund is able to assist some bursary recipients with free school lunches, transport costs and/or uniform grants.

Alleyn's Benevolent Fund:

23 pupils have been fully or partly funded by the Pupil Support Fund, 16 of whom received full or partial support for Educational Visits. The PSF has also helped bursary recipients with the cost of travel and/or music lessons.

USE OF FACILITIES

The National Youth Choir of GB

National Debating Contest

Regional heats for national debate held at Alleyn's involving 200 pupils from 31 secondary Schools across England.

PE lessons and Forest School

The playing fields are made available to two primary schools each week to deliver PE lessons and forest school activities to their pupils.

Venue Space

'The Dulwich Society', 'The Dulwich Festival', 'The Dulwich Decorative and Fine Arts Society' and 'The Dulwich Youth Orchestra' were provided with performance spaces for their various activities. 'The British Red Cross' held a dance show and fundraiser in our theatre

School Swimming

The swimming pool team delivered a learn-to-swim programme to three primary schools. A secondary school used the pool to film their students as assessment evidence for their PE GCSE. A local scout group were given 'rookie lifeguard' training by our pool staff.

Four local primary schools

use the fields and athletics track to host sports days, encompassing well over 2,000 pupils and parent spectators.

London School's Cricket Association

Regularly use the sports hall for winter nets and play numerous representative fixtures on the School's pitches. Annual awards evening held in the theatre.

Performing Arts

Four primary schools used the performing arts facility, with assistance from Alleyn's technical staff, to host end of term productions. The sixth form of a secondary school used the theatre to host their annual production; the same secondary school also hosted a large music camp culminating with an end of week performance
