

# 2017-18 Alleyn's School Public Benefit Summary

**Educational Links** = 240 Alleyn's pupils involved within the community across 42 partnerships.

**Financial Support** = 89 pupils received means-tested financial support in excess of £1.6m.

**Sharing Facilities** = 1167 hours of access to facilities were provided to both local schools and community groups involving over 4,000 people throughout the year, of these totals 580 hours of use were provided to local schools involving over 3,000 school children.

## EDUCATIONAL LINKS

### Volunteering

Pupils from Years 10-13 volunteer at local primary schools; Watergate School for children with severe learning disabilities; Residential Care Homes for the Elderly; and provide computer skills support for the elderly in the community.

### Rhythm for Reading

Year 12 students act as reading mentors to Year 4 pupils at local Primary Schools as part of an innovative music and literacy project.

**Southwark Schools Learning Partnership (SSLP)** a consortium of maintained and independent schools promoting links across the sectors.

### Saturday Maths

Four tutors teaching 52 Year 5 pupils from twelve local Primary Schools, with the help of over 50 Alleyn's pupil mentors from Year 11.

### Primary School Teaching

66 Year 12 students took part in our Outreach programme with 8 partner Primary schools, benefiting over 600 primary school children. Projects included Abstract Art (Belham), Science (Heber), Sport and Fitness (St. Anthony's), Dance and Storytelling (Harris Academy), Rhythm for Reading (Goodrich) Animation (Crawford) Drama (Elmwood) and Music (Rosendale).

### Sweet Readers

48 Lower School pupils working with elderly people suffering from Alzheimer's Disease

### Community Sports Leadership Award

11 Year 12 students gained their qualification based on volunteer work with local primary school children.

## FINANCIAL SUPPORT

### Means-tested Bursary Support

Alleyn's funds 89 means-tested bursaries (of which 61 are fully funded) and we are fundraising to increase that number. These bursaries are funded from money received from The Dulwich Estate, The Worshipful Company of Saddlers and other donors.

### Additional financial support

Money from the Dulwich Estate and the Pupils Support Fund is able to assist some bursary recipients with free school lunches, transport costs, uniform grants and other incidental costs.

### Alleyn's Benevolent Fund

26 pupils have been fully or partly funded by the Pupil Support Fund, 16 of whom received full or partial support for Educational Visits. The PSF has also helped bursary recipients with the cost of travel and/or music lessons.

### EMA Equivalent Payments

We continue to provide discretionary financial support to pupils in Years 12 and 13.

## CHARITIES

£12,089 split between two School Charities: Sparrow Schools, South Africa and Demelza Hospice for Children. Houses raised £19,593 between 8 charities: Burkina Health Foundation, British Heart Foundation, Veterans with Dogs, the Kashf Foundation, Royal Marsden, Women & Children First, The Refugee Council, Royal Orthopaedic Hospital Birmingham, and CALM. **Total raised = £31,682**

## SHARING FACILITIES

### Solidarity Sports

Charity hosted a sports day for children directly affected by the Grenfell Tower tragedy.

### School Sports Fixtures

Mini-football pitches are made available to the Lambeth & Southwark Primary Schools Football League to assist with their delivery of a 36 team 9v9 competition on a Saturday morning.

The Burbage Road Sports Ground has hosted cricket and football matches on behalf of two secondary schools in addition to hosting a South London Schools Football Association final and representative fixtures.

### School Sports Days

The fields and athletics track are used to host five sports days, encompassing well over 2,000 pupils and parent spectators.

### Venue Space

'The Dulwich Society', 'The Dulwich Festival', 'Dulwich Hamlet Football Club / Aspire Academy', 'Monte San Martino Trust' and 'The Dulwich Youth Orchestra' were provided with performance spaces for their various activities. 'The British Red Cross' held a dance show and fundraiser in our theatre.

### School Swimming Lessons

The swimming pool team delivered a learn-to-swim programme to three primary schools

### Southwark Volunteer Police Cadets

Continue to host a Christmas event distributing presents to children in care in Southwark.

### Dulwich Almshouse Charity

Free tickets to talks and shows held in our theatre are provided to Almshouse residents.

### London School's Cricket Association

Regularly use the sports hall for winter nets and play numerous representative fixtures on the school's pitches.

### School Performing Arts

Four primary schools used the theatre and performing arts facilities with assistance from Alleyn's technical staff to host end of term productions. The sixth form of a secondary school used the theatre to host their annual production.

### Local Parents Association Events

Our playing fields have hosted events on behalf of the Parents Association of two local schools; a fun-run raising funds for a charity and a lantern parade bringing the school community together.

### Woodcraft Folk Youth Group

The charity works with children on a weekly basis to promote confidence, understanding about the world and how to value each other.

### PE lessons and Forest School

The playing fields are made available to two primary schools each week to deliver PE lessons and forest school activities to their pupils.

### Resources for Autism

Used Alleyn's as a base to run their holiday play scheme giving parents and families caring for children with autism a few days respite.
